GOVERNMENT AND INSTRUCTION.

The general management of the School is vested in an Association of those to whose efforts it owes its origin. From their number is selected a Board of Trustees, a majority of whom can be of one denomination.

The immediate direction of the School is committed to the Principal, subject to the supervision of the Executive Committee, chosen from the Board of Trustees.

No pains whatever will be spared, by those who direct the course of instruction, at this institution, to render it as thorough and practical as possible.

EXAMINATIONS.

There is a public examination at the close of each term. Two weeks previous to the close are spent in reviewing the studies of the term.

THE ALPHA DELTA PHI.

The Alpha Delta Phi, a Society for improvement in Speaking and Writing, holds weekly sessions. At a meeting of this Society, held April 5, 1854, the following Preamble and Resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, the general diffusion of knowledge is the only sure basis of national prosperity, and whereas, this can only be obtained by a general interest in the subject of education, and by the establishment of good schools,

Therefore, Resolved, That we observe with pleasure the increasing interest of the public in elevating the character of our Common Schools. And whereas, this can only be effected by the establishment of schools of a higher grade, in which teachers may be qualified for the duties of their office,

Therefore, Resolved, That the founders of the Institute, by their

efforts to establish and sustain this institution, merit the thanks of all true friends of education.

Resolved, That we cannot too highly appreciate the merits of our present Instructor, whose unwearied zeal for the advancement of his pupils is manifested by persevering application to his arduous duties, and whose successful labors have rendered the school so worthy of the liberal and increasing patronage it receives.

Resolved, That we recommend the Institute to all who wish to receive thorough instruction in the studies pursued in academies.

Resolved, That the extensive patronage of the Institute is not in any way detrimental to our individual proficiency.

Resolved, That we tender our thanks to the teachers of both departments, for their successful endeavors to render their instruction beneficial to each member of the school.
