This is a hand-written ledger book containing records pertaining to the care of the poor in the Town of Litchfield. It contains, but is not limited to, contracts between the Town of Litchfield and various Keepers of the Poor for the care of paupers within the Town; agreements for the support of specific individuals; agreements for the operation and management of the Town's Poor Farm; and records of the supplies purchased by various managers of the Poor Farm. It also contains numerous loose bills, etc.

Due to the arrangement of the book it is not indexed.

This book was cataloged, microfilmed and digitized in 2012 as a project of the

one year from this date for the sum of \$275.00 two
hundred and seventy five dollars payable to wit
fifty eight dollars and seventy five cents (\$58.75) on
the first days of July, October, January & April and
they are to look after the interest of town farm and
disburse for the benefit of all. They are to receive
their board at the town house this agreement for one

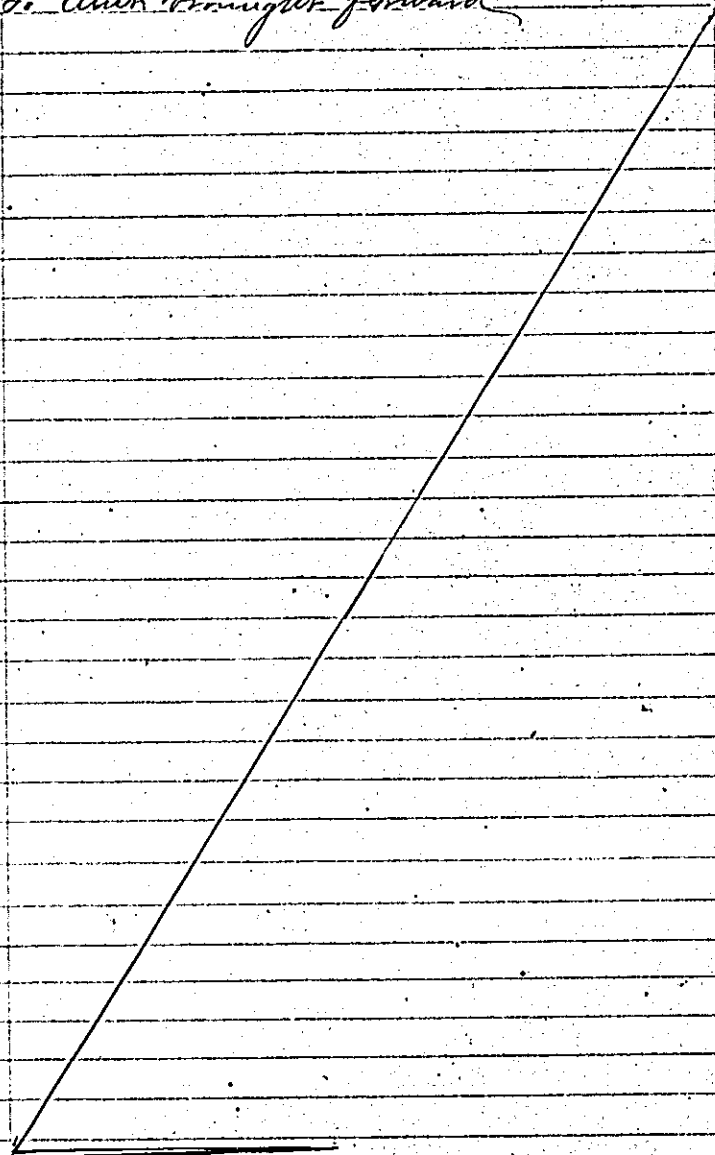
