In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to Notify and warn all of the White freeholders of said Town of twenty one years of age and upwards qualified by the Constitution and Laws of said State to vote in the election of State officers to meet and assemble at the north Baptist Meetinghouse in said Town on the second Monday of September next being the thirteenth day of said Month at one of the Clocks the afternoon to give in their votes for Governor of said State and also for four Senators to represent the County of Lincoln in the Senate of this State and also to choose a Representative to represent the inhabitants of said Town in the next Legislature of the State to be convened at Portland also to give in their votes for a Treasurer of the County of Lincoln and Representative of Lincoln District for the Congress of the United States you are likewise required to notify and warn said freeholders as are qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet and assemble at the same time and place to act on the following articles viz

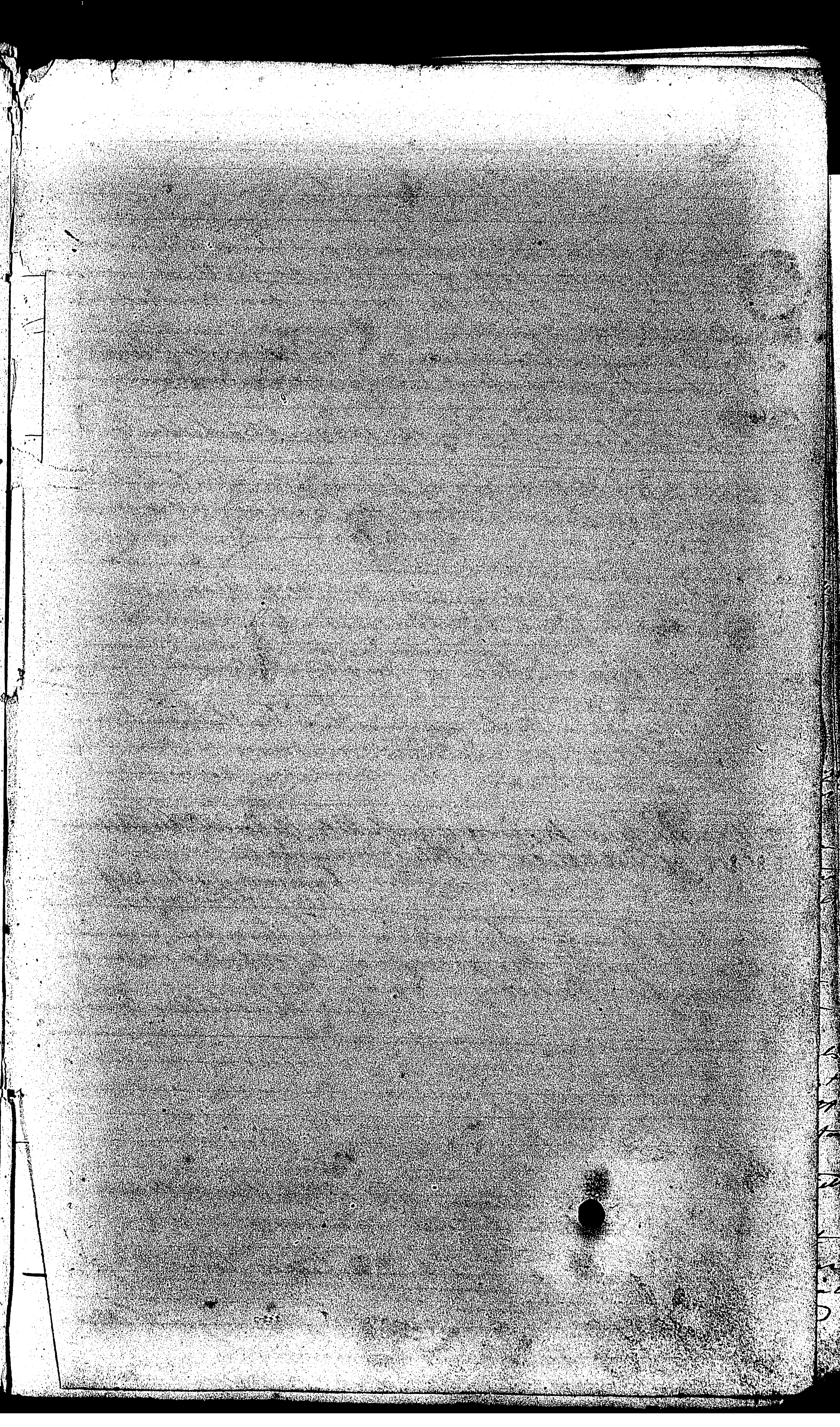

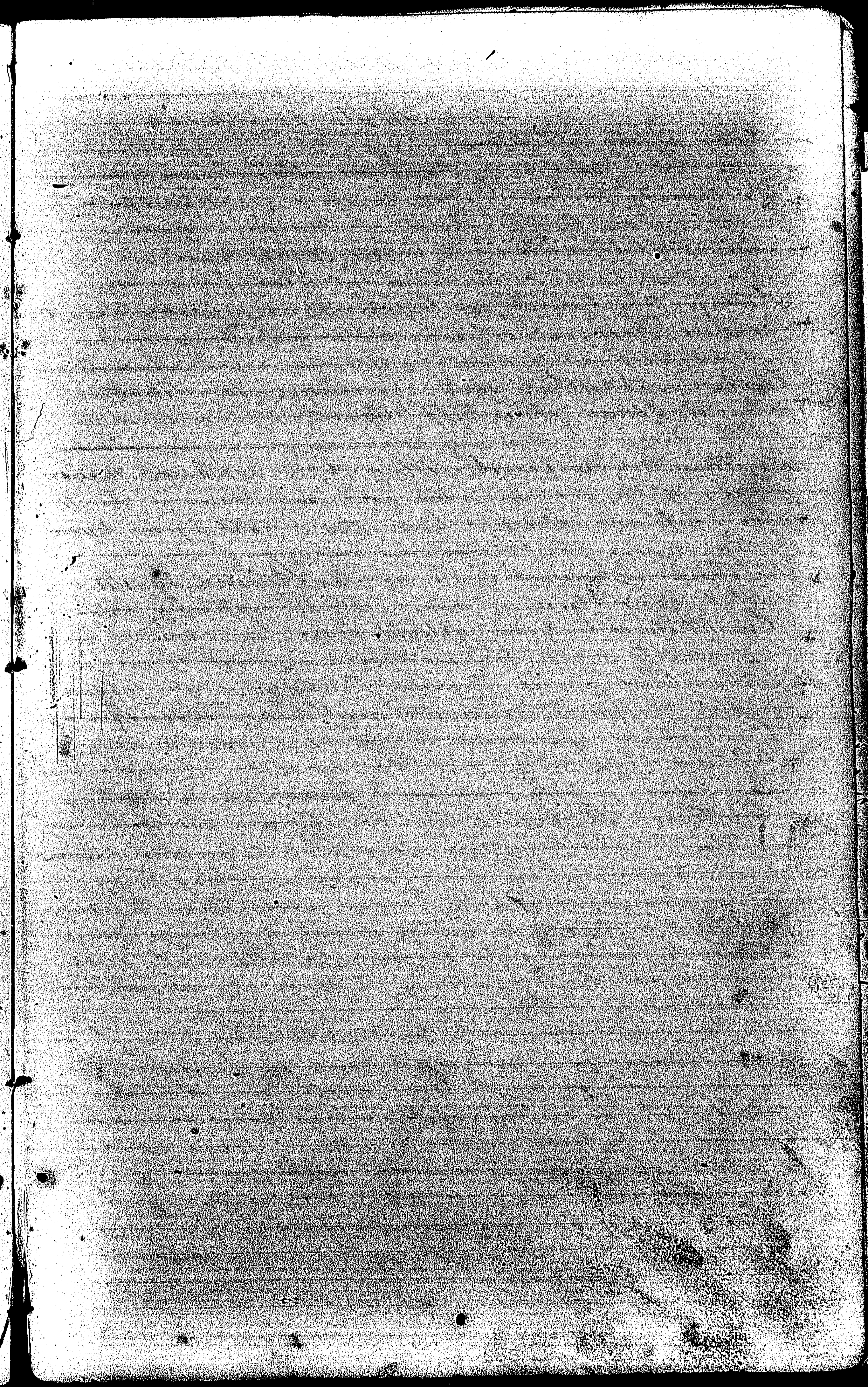



Note to Build the Bridge at the foot of Wagon

The Contractors to build the bridge in the following manner first the pier in the centre of the stream shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet long at the top twenty feet wide at the top and built in the following manner - that is to say it shall be built of split stone or flat ones and to commence on the bottom of the stream with a wall that shall be four feet thick at the bottom and three feet at the top said wall to extend all round said pier (unless Hollowell shall build one adjoining to it in which case the wall to be on three sides only) and to be built of split or flat stones of sufficient size for such a wall and to be well laid and locked together the centre to be filled with any kind of stone to within one foot of the top and the remainder with gravel or earth to ~~within~~ said pier to be eleven feet high from the bottom of the stream then to leave a better course that shall take not more than twenty feet covering them to build an abutment in the same manner and of the kind of materials and to be within six inches of the same height with the pier and twenty feet wide and to be extended fifty feet from the watercourse on to the shore then to lay stringers from the abutment to the pier that shall be sufficient for any weight usually passing on such bridges said stringers to be covered with the covering of the present bridge the whole of said bridge to be well railed built and finished in workmanlike manner

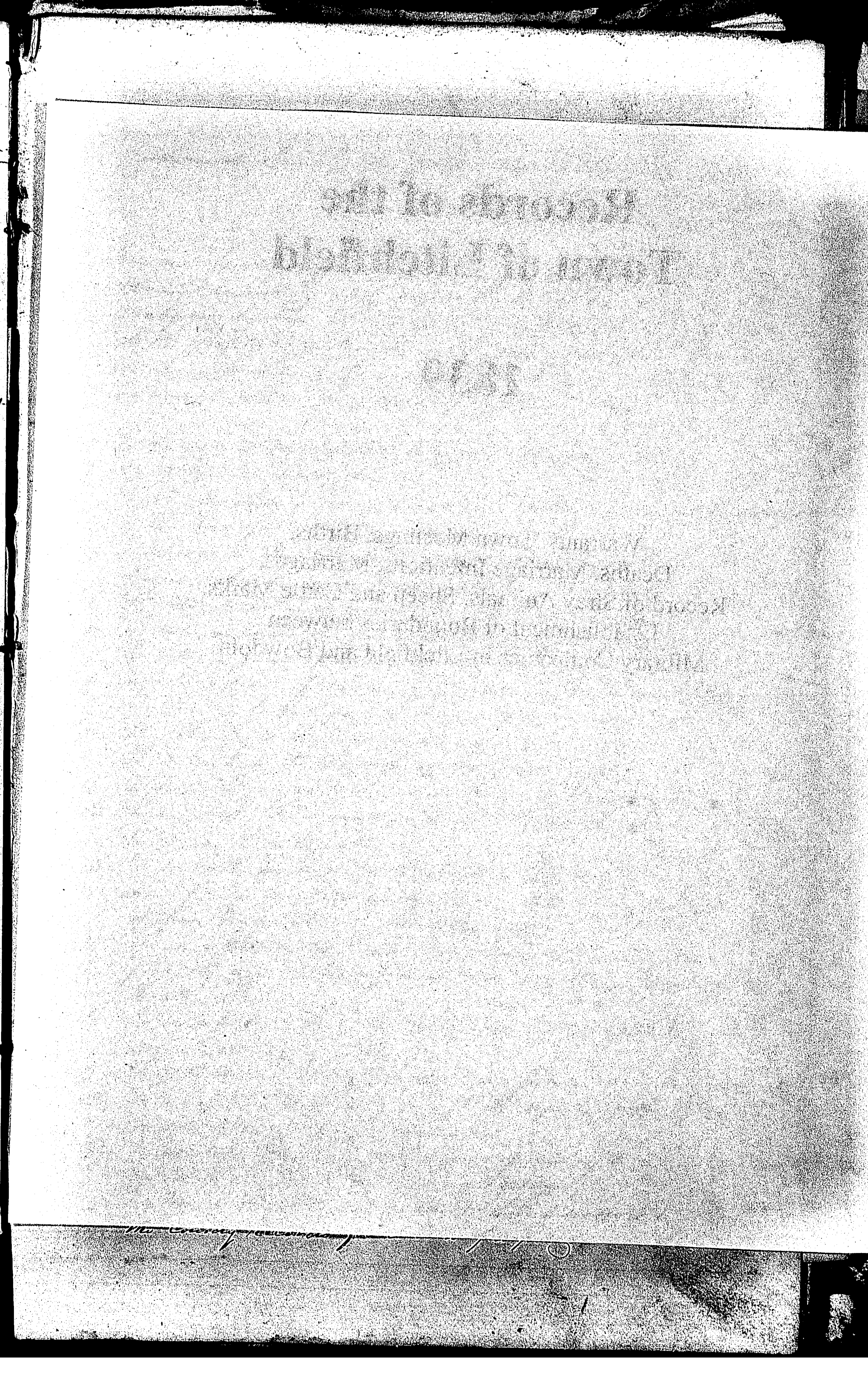

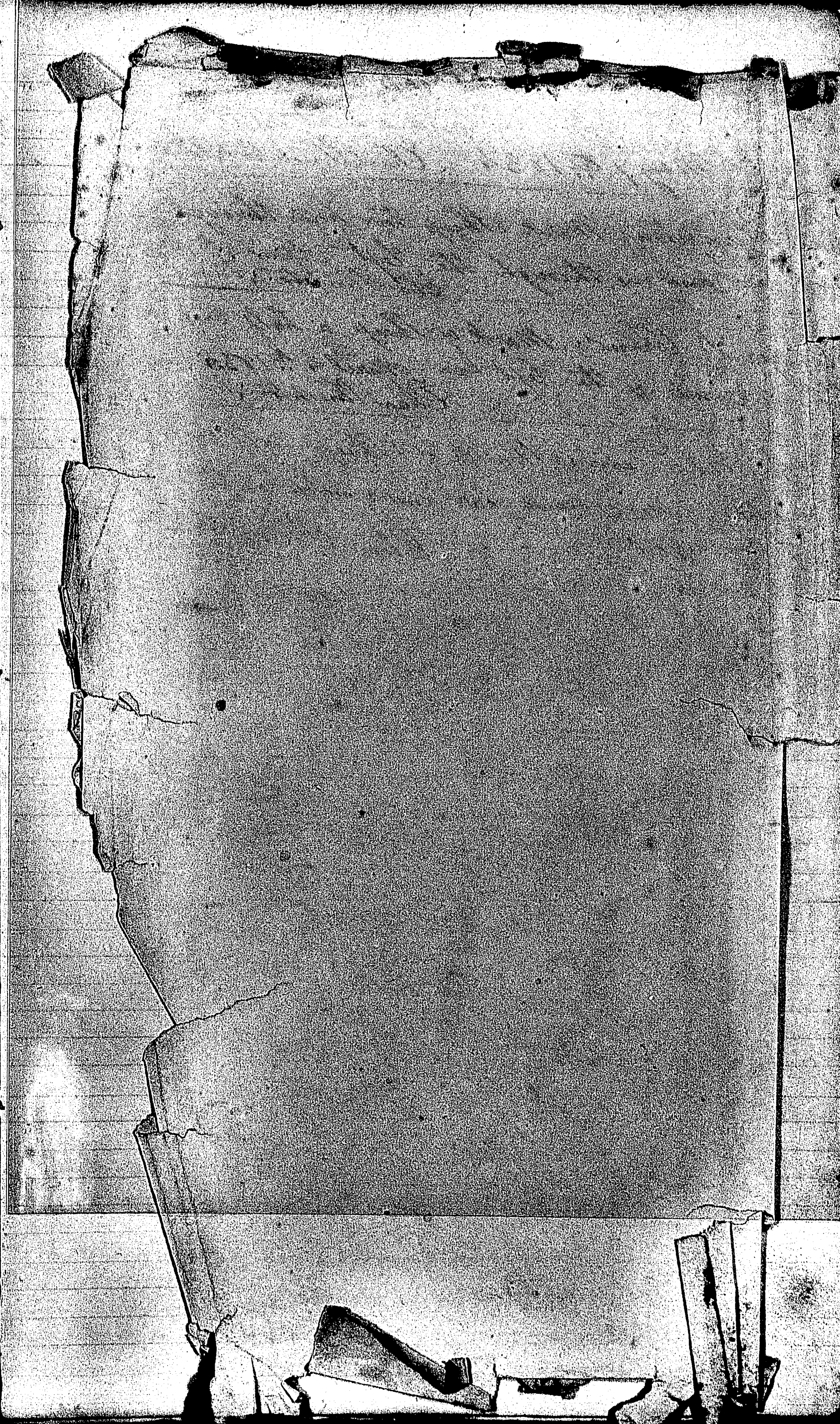
